A message from our new Director: Amy LaCivita

I am extremely honored to be named the Director of

The Piggyback Foundation. I've been married to my husband Jason

for 17 years and have three children Evan (14), Addie (10), and Lauren (8).

I have my Master's Degree from Tiffin University in forensic psychology and

experience in helping abused and neglected children in Huron County. My education has helped me work with children and families but what helps me fit as Director of the Piggyback Foundation is also the experience I had first hand with cancer.

Just over three years ago I was diagnosed with stage 2 breast cancer. During my week off of treatment a friend took me shopping at When Pigs Fly in Norwalk, Ohio. I had never heard of this adorable store right on Main Street. A woman who gave me the story behind the shop greeted me. I was amazed that something like this existed in our community. I was given a flyer for their fundraiser Cutting for the Cause being held at Christian Roberts Salon and Spa. I learned more about the Piggyback Foundation and the financial support that When Pigs Fly gives to the foundation every month.

I was then given an application to apply to be a Piggyback family. I kept this application for a while not sure of how this organization could help me. I was a stay at home mom and my husband was an assistant principal and coach. We paid our mortgage and car payments as well as other monthly bills. What I soon learned was how costly travel back and forth from Cleveland could cost. My plastic surgeon was located in Beachwood, Ohio. I traveled every other week there from January of 2016 until my final reconstruction in April of 2017. I soon realized we didn't have much to spend on the extras: the \$350 for my son to play travel basketball, nights and weekends out with the family and other extra expenses. A friend of mine encouraged me to apply and said that I would have nothing to lose. A Piggyback board member contacted me. She gave me the news that the board had approved my application.

I quickly learned that the foundation was made up of amazing people who gave their time helping the children and families in our community faced with life threatening diseases like cancer. Whether it was by volunteering at When Pigs Fly, to donating household items to the shop, to personal and corporate donations. I was able to learn about the circle of giving. The community donates to the shop, the shop sells the item, and the money goes back to the community. So many wonderful people touched the foundation. I was learning that these board members had prior experience helping middle class families just like mine. They had a way of knowing what I needed before I even did. That's the beauty of this foundation. When they learned of my double mastectomy scheduled for December of 2015 founder Lisa Hiler asked if I had a recliner. I did not. The foundation purchased a new recliner for me to recover in the days and months to come. I was speechless. What they so selflessly gave without any strings attached. I was also reminded of the foundations motto of maintaining normalcy for children in the home when I told my son that he would have to wait until next year to play AAU basketball. Lisa stepped in and sponsored him that year and boy was she right. I watched my son grow as a player and saw that for all those months of dribbling and shooting that basketball was a way he coped with my illness. It was a gesture that paid dividends. Not only was he given an opportunity to develop as a player, but it gave me a reason to leave my home when most days were filled with extreme anxiety. I was not going to miss a game no matter how bald, how sick or how anxious I was feeling.

I was given another wonderful surprise before my second surgery that once again reminded me of the foundation's mission. An overnight for my husband and three children Easter weekend at Kalahari. With growing anxiety I was not able to focus on anything but the upcoming surgery. The Piggyback Foundation changed that! By having that precious time with my family made the next few days easier to live. For that moment I was able to forget my situation and focus on my family having fun. A night at Kalahari was not something we would have planned during that time. I was and still am extremely grateful for that opportunity.

I was approached by Lisa in 2016 about the possibility of coming to work for the foundation once my youngest was in school. I jumped at the idea of paying it forward and working with children and families just like mine. I had experience in social work with abused and neglected children and court contracting with the juvenile judge in court custody cases. I have always been in the helping profession, just a different group being served. I now had the opportunity to use my experience of my cancer journey to help those around me. I can never fill Lisa's shoe that's for sure, but as the Director I will put my heart and soul into helping those families just like mine.

Peyton's Story by Martha Long



Peyton discovered she had cancer when she was just 4 ½ years old . I met Peyton as a feisty little fighter with a twinkle in

her eves in August of 2016. She had a rare form of cancer behind her nose, Embryoral Rhabdomyosarcoma. Peyton was my very first family. I fell in love with her precocious and witty personality. Peyton's' Daddy is her HERO. He persisted to take Peyton to Akron Children's Hospital after numerous ear infections and a visit to a hospital. Peyton coughed up what they thought was a blood clot. Peyton's Daddy didn't agree and took the so-called blood clot to Akronwhere it was tested and she was immediately diagnosed with cancer. Peyton had surgery and extensive chemo to follow in Akron. She spent her 5th birthday in a Chicago hospital undergoing a special procedure for her rare cancer. The next 6 months were spent going back and forth to Akron enduring many chemo treatments and testing.

We celebrated Peyton's first year cancer free by going to a Fairy Garden where Peyton learned wished do come true! Peyton has participated in 4-H, T-Ball and will be getting her picture taken with our Super Heroes this fall.

One of our goals here at Piggyback is to bring a little joy to our families; however, little Peyton has brought us more joy than we would have ever imagined!

Sophia came to our Piggyback Family as an adorable 8 – month old girl

with significant heart defects and other serious health issues, which were causing a failure to thrive at her tender age. Having already undergone one complex heart surgery, she needed another heart surgery immediately. After a successful operation and many follow up appointments, Sophia is a rambunctious toddler and doing better than her doctors had predicted! However, just when Sophia received a clean bill of health, her mother, Bianca was diagnosed with Stage 3 Papillary Thyroid Carcinoma in April of this year. It looks like the cancer has been eliminated and that there is little chance of reoccurrence. God is good! The foundation is blessed to be a part of this family's life and to have helped them through

this difficult time.

My wife - a recent cancer patient - learned of your organization through a nurse from University Hospitals Siedman Cancer Center at Firelands Regional Medical Center in Sandusky.

My wife was told to contact the foundation and then submit an application. Recently, our family was fortunate to receive word that The Piggyback Foundation would be willing to support our family in some manner. I cannot put in to words the impact your foundation has had in our lives in such a short amount of time. Our son who just turned 4 and daughter (2 1/2), were greeted during the home visit this week by two volunteers with small gifts, ultimately making both kids feel immediately comfortable. This showed me how well the organization truly understands the families you support.

A week or so prior, I was fortunate to have a genuine, in-depth conversation over the phone with Amy discussing our families situations, as well as the history, culture and philosophy of The Piggyback Foundation.

And just a couple weeks prior to that, my wife received a heartfelt letter in response to her application, including a check for groceries!

To say we are grateful is beyond an understatement; I cannot find the words to express our gratitude. During our home visit we were told all the ways The Piggyback Foundation has helped others in need. Just discussing the trials and tribulations with others who understand is helpful and therapeutic. But when we are told "we would like to ensure that your son is able to play soccer this session" or "we know you want both children to continue in Montessori school next year and want to help make that a reality", it literally brings tears to my eyes. It is a true Godsend.

This is a new experience for my family, one I never thought was possible - or even existed. My wife has been through so much and continues to fight every day, whether it be mental or physical. Having one less burden - even if it's just the ability to say "yes" to ice cream on a Friday night (instead of needing to save the money for another hospital bill) - makes a world of difference.

Even though there will be many more communications and actions between my family and your foundation, I needed to tell you how fortunate we feel to have your support. Tomorrow is Independence Day - a day to celebrate our country's freedom. As you know, some of those liberties feel as though they are taken away once effected by something as horrendous as cancer. But I want you to know, this will be an Independence Day our family will never forget; it's the first holiday since the disease where we have *something* in our corner that gives without taking, understands, and supports. That is The Piggyback Foundation. And for that, I say God Bless!
